New Validations and Messages

For NIH Research Performance Progress Reports (RPPRs)

Principal Investigators and their research staff should be aware of the upgrades to be deployed on February 27, 2019 to the National Institutes of Health (NIH) eRA Commons. The upgrade will include new validations in the Human Subjects System (HSS). The HHS is a shared system that enables grant recipients to electronically report and update their data on human subjects and clinical trials to NIH. <u>Read more</u> about the features and benefits of the HHS.

The New HHS Validations are:

- Enrollment and Randomization will be required when submitting an RPPR. Failure to do so will result in an Error Message, and the inability to submit the progress report.
- Studies that are still assigned Work In Progress status will receive a Warning Message upon submission of RPPR. Be sure to update status before submitting.
